

#### Message from Acharya Swamigal to NRI's devotees

> Acharya Swamigal on SURUTTAPPALLI A Unique Temple with a Unique Message

The village of Suruttappalli is situated on the Chennai-Tirupati highway in Chitoor district of Andhra Pradesh. The temple of Sri Pallikondeeswarar is located in this village. Situated on the border of Tamil Nadu with Andhra Pradesh, this temple bridges the two States. It is a km away from the border village of Uthukottai of Tamil Nadu, on the bank of river Aarani. This is an example of the growth of our culture on river banks.

This temple is unique in many ways. Lord Siva is seen here in lying down posture. Generally we see Siva in Linga form. A popular form of Siva is Nataraja. But here Siva is seen lying down; why? We all know from Purana that Siva drank poison for the good of the world, when the Ocean of Milk was churned. Siva is said to have come here and laid down in Anantha Sayana posture. When we look at this Pallikondeeswara, we are wonder struck; he does not appear to be an idol, but a living form. The way Siva is seen lying on the lap of Ambal leads us to wonder if the place is Sivaloka.

Yet another difference can be seen in this temple. Generally, Dakshinamurthy is seen in the posture of giving Upadesa (sermon). In some places he is seen surrounded by sages like Sanaka and others. But here Dakshinamurthy is seen blessing us together with Gowri as couple.

There is history too of this village. This temple is also related to sage Valmiki, the composer of Srimad Ramayanam. Vamiki prayed to Siva here before he wrote the epic. A Svayambhu Lingam appeared then. As Valmiki worshipped that Lingam, he came to be known as Valmikeswara and the kshetra became sacred. Valmikeswara appears along with Maragathambika as a couple. Kubera is seen here with Devi Gowri; Rama is with Sita, Bharata and Satrughna. Pradosha Nandi is famous here.

After Sri Maha Periyaval set his lotus feet here, this place has become a great Siva Sthala. The number of visiting devotees has been on the increase. That itself is a proof of this sacredness. In March 1979, Kumbhabhishekam was performed in a grand manner here at the sacred hands of Sri Jayendra Saraswathi Swamigal.

We have to devote our actions as Samarpanam at the lotus feet of the Lord. This will reduce unwanted tendencies and enable to spiritually develop ourselves.

#### Kumbhabhishekam by Acharya Swamigal

On Wednesday, 23rd January 2019 (Thai 9th), Kumbhabhishekam was performed from 9.30 to 10.30 a.m. in the holy presence of Acharya Swamigal. Thousands of devotees witnessed the Kumbhabhishekam of Maragathambika sametha Valmikeswara. Huge crowds of devotees descended on this village. Kalasa Abhishekam for all Gopurams was performed simultaneously to the accompaniment of Vedic chants by Veda Vidvans and Sivacharyas. A unique aspect was that Kumbhabhishekam was performed to more than sixty Murthis. More than seventy Veda Vidvans and Sivacharyas participated. Sri Periyaval delivered Anugraha Bhashanam after the Kumbhabhishekam. Acharya Swamigal honoured the Veda Vidvans and Sivacharyas

and conversed with and blessed all those who had toiled for the success of the Kumbhabhishekam. Acharya Swamigal asked them to continue with religious service with devotion.

They point to Nitya and Naimittika karmas that everyone must follow.

#### Special Editorial on Chaturmasya 2022

This Chaturmasya of Acharya Swamigal at Kakinada was a very eventful one. Several programmes were held and more than the number, the type of programmes were very significant. It is indeed the devotees' fortune to witness a galaxy of Vedic, Puranic, Cultural, Social, community oriented and academic programmes. All the programmes were held in the holy precincts of Goshala and in the Sannidhi of Lord Chandramouleeshwara. Also the various festivals during this Chaturmasya events were observed with pomp and grandeur. The Ganapathi Natyam on the last day of Ganapati Navaratri was a fitting finale. A grand Pushpabhishekam to Acharya Swamigal on the Vishwaroopa Yatra day was like a shining diamond on the crown. Dharma Prachara in all its aspects were covered.

Acharya Swamigal had a very hectic schedule. Nitya Trikala Chandramouleeshwara Puja, occasionally feeding the cows at Goshala, darshan to stream of crowds which included people from all sections of society, attending all programmes and delivering Anugraha Bhashanams, felicitating scholars and encouraging Vidyarthis, the day stretched from 6 AM in the morning and ended only at 12.30/1 Am in midnight. This year several Vidyarthis from Tamilnadu performed Parayanam, visited holy places around Kakinada and participated in Pujas. While Acharya Swamigal was keenly enquiring to the comfort and well being of devotees, Acharya Swamigal was keenly enquiring to schedule and care given to Vidyarthis at Srimatam camp. Devotees especially from South and several other places came to offer Bhiskavandanam and Pada Puja.

The inherent essence in all the events as noted in Acharya Swamigal's Anugraha Bhashanams was the stress to protect our Dharma & culture, appeal to youth to understand our religion completely and properly, supporting traditional families following Vedic life, cultivating service attitude, performing actions shedding ego and as a Samarpanam to Lord, being responsible citizens and dedicating oneself to development of nation and helping the cause of Dharma. The Anugraha Bhashanams touched a wide range of topics and quotations, from our ancient literature were aplenty and easily understood by devotees even by some who did not know the regional language. The devotees were rapt in their attention whenever Acharya Swamigal spoke. Interviews on activities of Math, spirituality and Dharma was also a regular feature. The Hindu religious & Endowments Department also held officer's refresher & orientation programme and this was attended by the Minister and senior officials. Prasadams from temples from AP was a regular feature.

With all the Pujas and Anushthanams, Acharya Swamigal went through this schedule with a smile and enthusiasm much to the awe of devotees. The Chaturmasya begun with worship to Vyasa Maharshi & all Gurus who gave us this hoary Vedic tradition and Acharya Swamigal went through the entire two months dedicating each moment to that cause.

All the Ahitagnis were honoured with special shawls, silver bowl, gold coin, Vastrams and Sambhavana in the divine presence Acharya Swamigal.


Devotees who contributed to the successful conduct of Agnihotra Sabha were blessed and given Prasadams.





Message of Acharya Swamigal on the 75th Anniversary of Indian Independence (15-Aug-2022)

'Bharata Varsha' is a sacred land, a Punya Bhoomi. It is not merely a geography or a physical entity, but a repository of great culture- a great civilization. It is a land of great spirituality - a place of Dharma. Blessed by the Gods and nurtured by holy sages, the Punya Bhoomi is venerable as our Mother land - "जननी जन्मभूमिश्च स्वर्गादिप गरीयसी - Janani Janma Bhumishcha Svargadapi Gariyasi- as remarked by Sri Rama addressing Lakshmana.

This holy land witnessed several trials and tribulations at different points in time in the past. Several sacrifices were made by men and women, families and the entire society. Finally, Bharat attained independence 75 years ago on the 15th August 1947, bestowing on us "freedom". The country was born again, unshackling itself from the bonds. People of our country kept immense faith and patience, throughout these difficult times, through their devotion to almighty and the Country.

Our Paramacharya Pujya Mahaswamigal had given a special message of blessings on the day of Independence in 1947 emphasising the spiritual greatness of our Nation and how the tricolored Indian Flag symbolises three Shaktis - Durga, Lakshmi and Saraswathi with the Chakra - the embodiment of Dharma in the middle. He also pointed out the importance of every individual to develop independence- one can consider himself independent if he can understand oneself fully. One must endeavour to develop that state of mind which ensures complete freedom.

75 years have passed since the birth of our Nation. Several developments have occurred, and several things have changed. That one constant which guides us all is our Sanatana Dharma - the bedrock of our civilization. Vedas and Shastras help sustain our Dharma. Upansihad says - Satyam Vada- Dharmam Chara - Dharma is the path on which we must lead our lives. It is the moral compass, it is the differentiator between the Good and Evil. If our country has withstood aggressions of various types for aeons, it is because, our people had the strength given to them by Dharma. Dharma can be translated as virtuous acts, as being good to others, being charitable, not harming anyone or anything, being truthful to our inner conscience. When the mortals digressed from the path of Dharma, God himself incarnated in different forms to uphold Dharma. Ramo Vigrahavan Dharma - Sri Rama was the epitome of Dharma and by his very conduct, he showed to the world the greatness of Dharma. Our puranas and Itihasas abound with episodes that show how the adharmic paths appear to be easy and successful, but the path of dharma even though riddled with difficulties is the one that leads us to victory ultimately - Truth alone Triumphs. Sage Tiruvalluvar in Tirukkural has written several profound couplets on Truth and Dharma. If one does not accept Dharma and is opposed to it, he or she is not only causing great harm to oneself, but also to the Society and the Nation.

Adi Shankaracharya through his teachings and works has not only guided us about the Advaita philosophy but has also shown the path of National Integration - so very vital for our Bharata. His yatras throughout the country from Kanyakumari to Kashmir and Kashi to Rameshwaram in his brief earthly sojourn instil in us a feeling of oneness. The Shankaracharya Hills in Kashmir are testimony to this. When forces inimical to our Dharma were increasing, He won over them through discussions and debate and reestablished the Dharmic way of life and established Shanmata - the six schools of worships, namely Ganapatyam, Saivam, Saktam, Sauram, Vaishnavam and Kaumaram. The seeds of unity sown by him provide the vital undercurrents for the Unity of our Nation to this day - despite diversities in different aspects like region, religion, language etc.

Ours is a very ancient civilization. It is the Bhumi of Rishi- Krishi - the land of Rishis and the land of agriculture. Our Dharma is unique and provides us with a broad mindset - we have always believed in the concept of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" and "Swadeso bhuvanatrayam" - the whole world is one for us. While we may not be most advanced or prosperous in materialistic terms, our Culture and civilization is the richest. Villages are the soul of our Nation - they show us the virtues of simplicity, of being content with limited wants, of being in harmony with Nature, of being altruistic.

If our Dharma could be propagated, it would lead to peace and happiness in the whole world. If there is any country in the world which can be a Guru in the realm of Dharma & religion, it can only be our country. Adi Shankara's teachings will provide us with a sound basis for peace and friendship not only among the people of India but also peoples of the whole world.

We pray to Lord Chandramouleeswara to shower His blessings on the entire Nation on this auspicious 75th Independence Day.

Ananyaa Rajesh, Dubai on 'Sriman Narāyaneeyam'

A boon given to mankind by Shri Melpathur Narāyana Bhattathiri. It is considered to have the power to eradicate any disease or sufferings. Narāyaneeyam has 100 dashakams or chapters with approximately 10 slokas in each dashakam. Totalling to about 1036 slokas, mostly each dashakam ends with 'paahi maam sarva rogaat' or 'nirundhi rogaan marutaalayesha' or 'deva vaataalayanaatha paahi maam' which translate to 'kindly remove all my ailments' or 'please protect me, Oh! Lord of Guruvaayoor!'.

Narāyaneeyam is the compact version of Srimad Bhāgavatam and has the essence of the same. The last sloka of the 8th chapter of Sriman Narāyaneeyam says:

asmin paraatman nanu paadmakalpe | tvamittham utthaapita padmayonihi || anantabhoomaa mama rogaraashim | nirundhi vaataalayavaasa vishno ||

Chandrasekharendra Saraswathi Maha Svamigal, the 68<sup>th</sup> Acharya of the Kanchi Peetam, himself said that this particular sloka can cure illnesses or diseases including cancer. If one sloka can cure cancer, no ailment can even approach a devotee who chants the Narāyaneeyam.

Shri Narayana Bhattathiri was suffering from a rare disease which he took from his Guru, as his Guru Dakshina. His Guru was free from the ailment, however his shishya was suffering. Along with his parents, he visited an astrologer after consulting many doctors. The astrologer said, "Start with the fish." His parents were simply clueless and had no idea what to do, for they were strict vegetarians. Those days, even common people followed traditions and considered the Lord as the supreme. However, the Sanskrit Scholar, Shri Battathiri went to see The Lord of Guruvayoor, The Blue-Hued one.

The Idol, carved out of a sacred material called Pathalanjana Sila was once worshipped by Maha Vishnu. After many generations it was worshipped by Sri Krishna's parents Vasudeva and Devaki and later installed in Dwaraka and worshipped by Krishna himself. The vigraha element, was found to not be existing on the earth! Devotees consider that it has come from Vaikuntha!

Bhattathiri started composing the Narāyaneeyam, starting with the Fish, Matsya Avataaram, sitting right in front of the Lord. Till date, when one enters the temple, they can see the spot where he sat writing the scripture. After each sloka, he would glance at the Lord, who would slightly tilt his head as a 'Yes', however if any mistake or error had to corrected, he would himself guide Bhattathiri. Legend has it, that, because of tilting his head too many times, the idol's head still is slightly tilt, even today! At times when he couldn't write anymore, had doubts, confusions, Bhagavaan himself would show the scene to him, and he would continue writing.

Bhattathiri, as mentioned before was a Sanskrit Scholar. His work is a treat for Sanskrit learners! For instance, The 35<sup>th</sup> dashakam, Ramaayana Charitham, second sloka has a line:

Maarge maarge mamaarge kapibhirapi tadaa tvatpriyaa saprayaasaihi || which translates to :

The monkeys engaged themselves in each and every maarga or route to find Raama's Priya or Raama's Wife,Sita.

Maarge maarge mamaarge! Every route's inside route's route! The poetry is so beautiful! Nectar indeed! One should definitely take the chance to learn such a wonderful Scripture given to us, which takes away all rogas and blesses us with 'Aayur Aarogya Saukhyam' ~ says the last sloka.



#### **Know Your Village**

## Vishnampettai (Thanjavur District) submitted by Smt. Uma Viswanathan

Vishnampettai is a village in Thanjavur district of Tamil Nadu. It is located 25Km towards west from Thanjavur and 328Km from state capital Chennai. Lalgudi, Nanjikottai, Thiruchirapalli are nearby cities. Pullambadi Rail Way Station, Aiyanapuram Rail Way Station are the nearby railway stations to Vishnampettai. Thiruchirapalli international airport is the nearest airport. Thirukkatupalli is the nearest town to this village for all major economic activities.



Vishnampettai is a beautiful village located in the banks of Kaveri river, Kollidam river and Kudamurutti river. The place derives its name from the two Gods "Vishnu" (situated at the west) and "Amman" (situated at the east), "VishnuAmmanPettai", later colloquially became "Vishnampettai". The village is also named as "Yaga Bhoomi", as there were so many Yagas, Bhajans & festivals were conducted by our ancestors like Sri Padmanabha Deekshithar, Sri Chandru Bagavathar, etc. These are still being conducted by the village people in the traditional method guided by them.

Main deity of the village: Vinayagar temple, Pavanamangalam



## Sri Kailasanathar temple (East)

This temple is located at the end of Vishnampettai village & surrounded by paddy fields. The temple is said to be built by the people of the Vishnampettai

agraharam. Main deities of this temple are "Sri Kailasanathar" & "Sri Kamakshi Amman"

Soorasamharam is performed in this temple during Sri Kandha Sashti festival followed by Sri Valli Kalyanam on the next day.

#### Sri Venugopalaswamy temple (West)

This temple, situated at the western side of the village, is more than 250 years old. Main deities are Sri Venugopalaswamy and Sri Rukmani & Sathyabama. Lot of festivals, Yagas & Namasankeerthanams were conducted by Gurus and are still being celebrated in the traditional methods.

> Uriyadi Utsavam - Starts on Gayathri Japam day, Uriyadi on the next day of Sri Krishna Jayanthi and

ends with Sri Rukmani Kalyanam on the next day

- Sri Ramanavami Starts 8 days before Sri Ramanavami and ends with Sri Seetha Kalyanam which is conducted on the next day
- Vaikunda Ekadasi Vaikunda Ekadasi and Radha Kalyanam on the next day
- Navarathri festival is celebrated at the temple with Namasankeerthanam which is specially performed by "Sankeeth Ladies Bhajan Mandali" and ends with dance program by children on Saraswati Poojai day



- ➤ Purattasi Special poojas conducted by mandagapaditharar/upayatharar on every saturday of Purattasi month and Santhanakappu will be conducted collectively by villagers on the last saturday of Purattasi
- Ekadasi Every ekadasi, special Poojas are conducted by the Mandagapaditharar/Upayadharar and Namasankeerthanam performed in the late evening by village bhajan group

#### Arulmigu Sri Ponni Amman temple, Pavanamangalam

This temple is located in Pavanamangalam village, 6Km from Vishnampettai Agraharam. It is a small temple with main deity "*Ponni Amman*" and also has sannadhis for Karupannansamy, Madurai Veeran and Ravuthar who are considered to be Kaaval Deivangal. "*Ponni Amma*" is our Kula deivam and we visit the temple at least once a year to offer Maavilaku and perform abhishekam, Sandhana kaapu, Velli kaapu for Amman! Kumbabhishekam was last performed in the year 2007 and yet to be performed after that.



#### Sri Karumbeswarar temple (Semmeninathar), Thirukkanur (North)

This is an ancient temple located in the north west of Vishnampettai village and in the south bank of Kollidam river. It is the 56<sup>th</sup> Shiva temple on the northern bank of Cauvery river and praised in several hymns by Thirunagnanasambandar, Thirunavukkarasar, Sundaramoorthy Nayanar: 110<sup>th</sup> Devaram padal, 73<sup>rd</sup> pathigam of 1<sup>st</sup> Thirumurai, 76<sup>th</sup> pathigam of 5<sup>th</sup> Thriumurai, 47<sup>th</sup> pathigam in 7<sup>th</sup> Thirumurai.



The temple is believed to be 2000 years old and built by the Pandiyas & renovated several times by the Cholas. The temple was submerged in 1924 flood in the banks of Kollidam. The top portion of the kalasam was discovered by a shepherd using a sugarcane tree grown above it and was further excavated, hence the Lord is known as "Karumbeswarar".

Sun rays fall on the Lingam in a specific date of the second, third & fourth of April, every year, hence these days are special when Lord Surya is believed to come here & worship the Lord.

The Shiva lingam here is one of the 64 Suyambhu lingams. The goddess is "Soundarya Nayaki" and she is also known as Sivayoganayaki. The ambal here has not got a crown but is seen to be having Jadamudi (long braided hair). Ambal at this temple is made out of Salagramam. The theertham here is veda theertham.

Parvathi was once separated from Shiva and had come to the earth to perform penance to unite with Him. She found this village at Thirukkanur suitable for the same. Pleased with Her devotion, the Lord appeared before Her as a column of fire. Due to the heat He was red in colour and hence He came to be known as *Semmeninathar*; sem meaning red and meni meaning body. The nandi at this temple is seen in a very unique posture - with its front left leg planted on the ground and ready to get into a standing position. It is in a posture ready to execute instructions from Lord Shiva.

It is believed that the village was submerged by sand due to the curse of a pregnant woman, the villagers then moved to Vishnampettai & settled there. An ancient name for Thirukkanur is Manalmedu (mound of sand).

There is a belief that visiting this temple as a couple will clear all misunderstandings and result in a happy marital life. Praying at this temple is said to improve career prospects, remove obstacles to marriage & improve health for those afflicted with chronic illness. Childless couple are blessed with progeny by doing abhishegam to Shiva and Ambal and offering garland of erukkam flowers!

Sooriya Poojai (April 2, 3, 4) is the main festival, while Pradosham, Maha Shivarathri, Aavani moolam, Thai Pournami abishekam are other important festivals in this temple!

This village is located in the banks of Kaveri river, Kollidam river and Kudamurutti river

#### Yearly Thiruvizha:

 Uriyadi Uthsavam at Sri Venugopalawamy temple. The is the grand festival celebrated for 10 days and with Veda parayanams by celeberated Sanskrit scholars, bhajans from various artists that goes past midnight.

- Soorasamharam & Sri Valli Kalyanam at Sri Kailasanathar temple
